Financial Need

When you apply for federal student aid, the information you report on the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) is used to calculate your Expected Family Contribution (EFC). The formula used to calculate your EFC is established by law and is used to measure your family's financial strength based on their income and assets. The EFC and your Cost of Attendance (COA) as shown above is used to determine your eligibility for federal student aid. If your EFC is below a certain amount, you will be eligible for a Federal Pell Grant, assuming that you meet all other eligibility requirements. There isn't a maximum EFC that defines eligibility for the other financial aid programs. Instead, your EFC and COA are used in the following equation to determine your financial need:
